# Debt swap agreement

- Agreement of the DEPT2HEALTH program to swap Mongolia's debt to Germany through the Global Fund. This program is additional funding and grants for the country's health policies and activities, and this activity is the country /Mongolia/ in case of debt to the financing country, according to the SWAP agreement, the creditor cancels the loan and transfers the debt to health activities, taking into account the budget of the borrowing country for the health sector, through the Global Fund's health-oriented activities.
- On September 25, 2023, the first agreement on the debt conversion of Mongolia's debt through the Global Fund was successfully organized with Germany.
- As for Germany, it is one of the 5 largest donating countries of the Global Fund, and during the 7th Global Fund Fundraising campaign, a total of 16 billion US dollars was raised, of which Germany contributed 1.4 billion US dollars and 1.2 billion US dollars in cash and 100 million curos coming in through the debt swap mechanism.
- For the Dept2health program, 12 funding programs totaling 226 million US dollars have been implemented so far.
- The 29 million euros debt swap agreement between Mongolia and Germany is the 3rd large-scale agreement and the 9th agreement conducted by Germany.

CCM Choir Kh. Ganbaatar: The Government of Germany offered to Mongolia a €29m debt to health swap to be implemented through the Global Fund for HIV, TB and building resilient and sustainable systems for health. In this regard, we need to write a new project and submit it to the GF and Government of Germany. The Government of Mongolia and Health Minister Chinzorig proposed to establish a specialized hospital for TB and HIV. But Fund Portfolio manager Allan informed that it will not be spent on building a hospital. It is necessary to write this project within March and April. Guidelines and recommendations will be provided by the GF soon.

Ts. Bazarragchaa: I appreciate that Mongolia is becoming debt-free to Germany. In the approved budget of Mongolia for 2024 in the health sector it included a budget for building of the NCCD II. The construction of a new hospital also included in the 2024 government agenda. Therefore, 29 million euros should be spent on other things than building a hospital. For example, it should be spent on the activities included in the PAAR section, which could not included in the 2024-2026 grant, and activities to increase active detection.

# Article 15. Oversight Committee

- 15.1. The CCM shall establish the Oversight Committee with the function of overseeing the Global Fund supported program implementation in the fields of finance, human resource, management, performance.
- 15.2. The Oversight Committee members shall be elected for two years term at the OCM meeting with 51% or more votes.
- 15.3. The composition of the Oversight Committee may include representatives of the Principle recipient units in charge of monitoring, supply and finance.
- 15.4. The Oversight Committee shall have an oversight plan that includes detailed activity, timeline, and oversight cost within the budget, and shall present its implementation to all CCM members via email and at the CCM meetings.
- 15.5. In the course of conducting the oversight activity, the Oversight Committee shall receive recommendations made by non-Oversight Committee members, representatives from the key affected population and people living with these diseases.

# Article 16. Conflict of Interest Committee

- 1. Are there any newly selected organizations among the 5 SRs that will implement projects in 2024-2026?
  - 2. If the GF project is stopped by 2026 in Mongolia, the organization that will continue to carry out integrated activities in the field of infectious diseases is the NCCD. Is there a clause in the new project agreement with the NCCD to coordinate and support the activities of other SR organizations?
  - J. Narangerel: The new project agreement signed with the NCCD has included that clause, it stated that NCCD will receive the activity reports of the 5 SRs on a quarterly basis. The financial report shall received and monitored by the PCU. Accordingly, a Working group was established at the NCCD and held a meeting with the leaders of 5 SR organizations on February 27. At the meeting, it was decided to regularly exchange short-term online reports for each 5 SRs who visited which districts and how many new cases they were detected with each other.
  - Ts. Bazarragchaa: The names of the 6 packages of SR organizations presenting now and in the report presented at the 97th CCM meeting held in Hall A of the MoH are different, Please provide information on this.
  - J. Narangerel: The information presented at this meeting and 97<sup>th</sup> CCM meeting is still the same, nothing has been changed by the PCU. The designations written in here and the designations placed on the tender are the same. We will double check again and get back to you.
  - Kh. Ganbaatar: According to the T. Bazarragchaa member's request, we will check and if there is any information that is different from the project information that was written and submitted, MoH and the PCU will be officially notified by the CCM. T. Bazarragchaya member, you are obliged to check the designations accordingly.

NGG.	D. Munkh-Erdene: You were mentioned that the former SRs were selected by the tender. I assume that there was a certain amount of competition in the tender selection process. Please let us know how many organizations materials were received in the tender process.
же	J. Narangerel: 12 organizations submitted their materials on 6 packages of tender in total. Among these, at least 1 and at the most 3 organizations were submitted requests for 1 package. For example: Mongolian Tuberculosis Association participated in the previous project to reach out to people at risk and vulnerable groups of tuberculosis through Public Health Workers in Package-3, and 2 other organizations submitted materials for this package. Package-4, Establishing a community-led monitoring system for TB care, only 1 organization submitted the material. For this new grant cycle, the selection process of the SR was carried out in accordance with the Tender Law of Mongolia, and materials were accepted by online and selected by the tender committee. As it is the first time, there were problems such as e-registration process according to the Tender Law. The tender committee consisted of 7 people, and the committee was established by the order of the State Secretary of MoH.
NSO	G. Oyuntuya: You mentioned that experienced SRs which previously implemented the projects were selected. Will the selected SR organizations cooperate with these submitting organizations who have not been selected as SR? How the CCM members participate in these activities?
PCD	J. Narangerel: PR has not given any direction in this regard.

Ganbaatar: However the CCM members do not have the right to directly participate in the activities of the PR and SR, but we have the right to review and oversight the project implementation process. If there is a violation, if it does not match with the goals, or if there are unimprovement activities, we have the right to notify the MoH and PCU. CCM Secretariat already set the site visit plan for that.
50000	B. Tuya: Please explain why did not include CCM members as an observer in the SR selection process?
FCU	J. Narangerel: PCU tried to including the CCM members and LFA representatives in the SR selection tender process. Although, D. Bayarbold, the GF project head and the State Secretary of MoH sent an official letter to the CCM Chair that the representatives of the CCM could enter the Tender Committee as an observer. Unfortunately, the Tender Committee, established under the Tender Law, refused to participate the CCM in the 2 meetings due to the fact that it must be independent and non-committee external members cannot be included as observers in international project tender.
NGO	B. Tuya: Is there a written protocol about this? On the guidelines of the Global Fund it mentioned that CCM should oversight the SR selection process. In this case, we should explain to the GF why the representative of the CCM was not included in this SR selection process.
CCM Clair	Kh. Ganbaatar: CCM sent an official letter to MoH with the names of 3 members of CCM to working as observer in the Tender Committee, but they did not include them due to lack of A3 certificate. We should inform to the GF that MoH did not let CCM to participate as an observer in the tendering process of the SRs.
PCU	J. Narangerel: We have the meeting minutes of that. Later, Tender Committee agreed to include the LFA representative, but the member who was going to be included was replaced by new one. Therefore, LFA could not attended the tender process as well. The representatives of the PCU cannot participate in the tender process as well and PCU were informed to Allan manager accordingly. Fund Portfolio manager informed that let Tender Committee to work on the selection of the SRs according to the Tender Law of Mongolia, and once it is done they will ask LFA to examination for this SR selection tender process.
CCM locurtain	J. Bulgan: The CCM Secretariat has worked together with the PCU on this issue. However, 7 members of the Tender Committee voted against sitting CCM as observer, so we could not participate in the SR selection process.
NGO	B. Tuya: Will the 5 selected SRs cooperate with the SSRs? The budget is high, but the deadline is tight, and the staff of NGOs are limited, so should they work with consultants or SSRs?
PCU	J. Narangerel: SRs have the right to cooperate with SSRs, consultants and subcontractors by signing contracts according to the law. For example: There are previous experience of working with a PR company to making short videos for advertising. For your information, the 2 organizations which selected for HIV/AIDS Package-5 and 6 have been contracted to operate with performance-based funding. PCU has been transferred 40% of the funding already, the remaining 40% will be transferred in the half of the year and the rest of 20% funding will be transferred in January or February next year. These 2 organizations will plan and decide their activities by their own.
CNCU	S. Zolbayar: There is some clarification on the tender selection process. It was mentioned that I organization submitted material on some of the packages. If only 1 organization submitted the material, that package tender will not be re-announced. Was it no need to compare with another organization?
icu	J. Narangerel: Tender Committee examined the material of that I organization which submitted their material on the package, and considered them as meeting the requirements of the ordering party. There are also I organization submitted material for Package-4, which was checked and returned as not meeting the requirements, and it was decided to re-announce the tender on Package-4.
CCM	Kh. Ganbaatar: The financing of the activities of the new SRs begins from January 1, 2024, but the contract was

- made on February 7, 2024. How was it decided to manage the unused funds during this period? The GF informed that a transition schedule should be drawn up, and if the funds cannot be fully used, the remaining funds will be confiscated. J. Narangerel: January salary and office rent were not given. It was decided to pay salaries and other expenses PCU from the February by all organizations to compensate for the expenses of February operations. Kh. Ganbaatar: Thank you to the PCU coordinator J. Narangerel for sharing the information to all CCM members. As for the newly elected CCM members information, the implementing of HIV/AIDS and TB projects is a very delicate and professional activity. For example: Transporting of sputum samples from rural areas and sum 化生物 not easy to be done by any organization other than Association of Mongolian Sum Medical Specialists NGO. The recommendation given by the GF is to support and cooperate with organizations that have experienced in implementing projects before. As a result, in the event that if the GF project is stopped, it was mentioned that these organizations will be supported to continue their cooperation with the NCCD. P. Anuzaya: After the completion of the GF project of 2024-2026, it is necessary to ensure further stability. In WHO: accordance with that related sustainability plan is required. Please provide more information on this issue. J. Narangerel: If the GF project is stopped from 2026, in order to ensure the stability of the project the transition plan has been included in the work plan of the Public Health Department of the MoH of this year. The specialist who is responsible for this issue is working on it, a working group will be appoint soon and preparations are being PCU: made at the moment. There is a transition plan previously made by the Pharos team, which will be reviewed and approved for further changes by MoH.


